

ORDINANCE 2004-05

An ordinance to close/ vacate one/half block of the northern most part of Elm that is North of fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) street and dead ends at the property owned by Billy and Marilyn Perkins.

Whereas, a petition was duly filed with the City of Perryville, Arkansas on the ninth day of September, 2004 asking the Perryville Council to vacate and abandon that portion of Elm that is North of Fourth Street and joins the East side of lot #38 of the Matthews addition and that portion of Elm that is North of Fourth Street and joins the West side of lot #37 of the Matthews addition and dead ends at the South line of property owned by Billy and Marilyn Perkins. This part of Elm is approximately 45' by 90'.

Whereas, after due notice as required by law, the council has at the time and place mentioned in the notice, heard all persons desiring to be heard on the question and has ascertained that the street or the portion thereof, hereinbefore described, has not been actually used by the public generally for a period of at least five (5) years subsequent to the filing of the plat; that all the owners of the property abutting upon the portion of the street to be vacated have filed with the council their written consent to the abandonment; and that public interest and welfare will not be adversely affected by the abandonment of the street.

Now therefore be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Perryville, Arkansas:

Section 1. The City of Perryville, Arkansas releases, vacates, and abandons all its rights, together with the rights of the public generally, in and to that part of North Elm as designated above.

Section 2. A copy of this ordinance duly certified by the signature of the Perryville Mayor and Perryville Recorder/Treasurer shall be filed in the office of the recorder of the county and recorded in the deed records of the county.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.





An ordinance to close/vacate one-half block of the northern most part of Elm that is North of Fourth (4th) Street, and dead ends at the property owned by Billy and Marilyn Perkins.

Whereas, a petition was duly filed with the City of Perryville, Arkansas, on the ninth day of September, 2004, asking the Perryville Council to vacate and abandon that portion of Elm that is North of Fourth Street and joins the East side of Lot No. 38 of the Matthews Addition and that portion of Elm that is North of Fourth (4th) Street and joins the West side of Lot No. 37 of the Matthews Addition and dead ends at the South line of property owned by Billy and Marilyn Perkins. This part of Elm is approximately 45' by 90'.

Whereas, after due notice as required by law, the council has at the time and place mentioned in the notice, heard all persons desiring to be heard on the question and has ascertained that the street or the portion thereof, hereinbefore described, has not been actually used by the public generally for a period of at least five (5) years subsequent to the filing of the plat; that all the owners of the property abutting upon the portion of the street to be vacated have filed with the council their written consent to the abandonment; and that public interest and welfare will not be adversely affected by the abandonment of the street.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
