

ORDINANCE NO. 1997-1

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, ARKANSAS, AND TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES FOR SAID MEMBERS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, ARKANSAS:

Section 1. That the law enforcement and protection of the City of PERRYVILLE, Arkansas, shall be vested in and delegated to the hereinafter established police department. The police department is hereby established, as the law enforcement and protection agency for the purpose of preserving peace, maintaining order, and enforcing the law and ordinances of the City of PERRYVILLE, Arkansas.

~~Section 2. That the police department shall consist of one person known and designated as the Chief of Police, and such other police officers as the City Council may provide, who shall meet the requirements of the laws of the State of Arkansas and rules as may be prescribed by the City Council from time to time. Said Chief of Police shall be appointed in accordance with the laws of the State of Arkansas. Said police officers shall be appointed by the Chief of Police.~~

Section 3. That the membership of the police department shall be determined by the City Council, from time to time, increasing or decreasing the membership as occasion demands and their salaries shall be fixed and determined by the City Council subject to the increase or decrease as the occasion demands.

Section 4. The police department and its membership shall be the law enforcement and protection agency charged with the responsibility for law enforcement, protection, preservation of peace and order with the City of PERRYVILLE, Arkansas.

Section 5. All ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

MAYOR CHARLES ROLAND, JR. CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 7:15 P.M. THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 1997. THE COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT WERE BOB WEGNER, ROBERT BRAZIL, KENNETH BRANDON, AND JOEL WOOLF. THE GUEST PRESENT WERE OFFICER RANDY WILSON AND AL WARNEKE.

THE FIRST LINE OF BUSINESS ON THE AGENDA WAS THE APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 11TH COUNCIL MEETING. THE MAYOR ASK FOR A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS WRITTEN. BOB WEGNER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FOR THE SEPTEMBER 11TH COUNCIL MEETING. ROBERT BRAZIL SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR.

MAYOR CHARLES ROLAND ASK THAT THE COUNCIL FILL THE POSITION OF LEON MC MORAN WHOSE RESIGNATION WAS EFFECTIVE THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER. JOEL WOOLF MADE A MOTION TO ELECT TOMMY YOUNG TO FILL LEON MC MORAN'S POSITION AS CITY COUNCIL MEMBER. ROBERT BRAZIL SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR.

THE MAYOR PRESENTED TO THE COUNCIL A BID FROM PALADINO-NASH FOR A FOURTEEN INCH WATER LINE THAT WILL REPLACE THE EXISTING EIGHT INCH WATER LINE ON SCENIC ROAD LOCATED ACROSS THE STREET FROM DR HYATT'S RESIDENCE TO THE WATER TANK. JOEL WOOLF MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE BID OF \$50,754.60 TO REPLACE THE EXISTING WATER LINE. ROBERT BRAZIL SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR.

THE MAYOR INFORMED THE COUNCIL THAT PAY ESTIMATE NO. 4 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$106,685.64 FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT PROJECT TO PERKINS & ASSOCIATES WAS PAID.

THE MAYOR ASK THE COUNCIL TO PASS ORDINANCE NO. 1997-1 WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SECTION II WHICH DOES NOT APPLY TO OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT. ORDINANCE NO. 1997-1 IS AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, ARKANSAS AND TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES FOR SAID MEMBERS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. BOB WEGNER SPONSORED THE ORDINANCE. THE ORDINANCE WAS READ IN ITS ENTIRETY BY THE RECORDER, SUSAN RIEDMUELLER. BOB WEGNER MADE A MOTION TO SUSPENDED THE SECOND READING. JOEL WOOLF SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR. BOB WEGNER MADE A MOTION TO ADOPT ORDINANCE 1997-1. JOEL WOOLF SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR.

THE MAYOR CHECKED ON THE PRICES OF NETS FOR THE TENNIS COURTS. THE COUNCIL DECIDED TO TABLE PURCHASING THE NETS UNTIL FURTHER INFORMATION IS OBTAINED. MR. A.L. WARNEKE VOLUNTEERED TO CONSTRUCT A BACK BOARD FOR THE TENNIS COURT IF THE CITY WOULD FURNISH THE MATERIALS. ROBERT BRAZIL MADE A MOTION THAT THE CITY FURNISH THE MATERIALS FOR MR. A. L. WARNEKE TO BUILD A BACKBOARD ON THE TENNIS COURT. JOEL WOOLF SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL WERE IN FAVOR.

RANDY WILSON, CITY MARSHAL, WAS PRESENT AT THE MEETING TO ASK THE COUNCIL TO CONSIDER REPLACING THE EXISTING POLICE CAR THAT HE IS NOW DRIVING. THE CAR CAUGHT ON FIRE WHILE PARKED AT THE TASTEE FREEZE WITH THE ENGINE RUNNING. THE APPROXIMATE COST TO REPLACE THE EXHAUST SYSTEM, REPAIR THE WIRING, AND REPLACE THE CARPET WOULD BE \$2,000. THE ENGINE HAS AROUND 100,000 MILES ON IT AND TO REPLACE THE TRANSMISSION WOULD COST \$6,700. THE MAYOR AGREED WITH THE IDEAL OF PURCHASING ANOTHER POLICE CAR BUT WOULD LIKE TO KEEP THE OLD POLICE
